B: I see. By the way, they have a drama festival.

B: Sounds exciting. Are you interested in it?

A: Of course. They make the stories on their own. That's nice!

B: Really? Do they make their own stories?

A: Yes! And the costumes. They are making them for the drama festival.

B: Do they make their costumes, too?

A: Yeah, I think so.

B: How about sports activities?

A: Looks fun! I want to try something new for me.

B: Good for you. I'm not good at sports. I like watching them. By the way, what is AFL?
